Former President, Michael Crutcher steps down after eight years at the helm and will continue to contribute to QMusic as a Committee Member.

After spending 20 years touring and recording with Brisbane band Powderfinger, JC turned his focus to the world of live music venues, opening The Triffid in 2014 and The Fortitude Music Hall in 2019.
